The last year of the competition committee has been just as busy as the previous year if not busier. The entire committee has made many sacrifices of their precious free time to volunteer themselves to maintaining Association competitions in an efficient and consistent fashion. Each member of the committee has offered their services to keep the Association competitions and tournaments flowing and to just say thank you to them seems so inadequate and so miniscule in light of what they have done, but thank you is all that one can say, and is all that they require as a reward for a job well done. They do not seek the limelight for their efforts; they just seek the occasional well done or thank you. So, I pause here to thank them just one more time. Anne Thomas, our Tuesday Night and Thursday Night competition secretary who keeps over 40 teams happy every week, Sharon Mitchell who keeps our 25 teams on a Saturday happy, Lyn Buchanan who has worked at more tournaments and competition days than anyone else on the committee bar Rod as well as playing "Mummy Bear" to all the youngsters in the bottom division and helping them to learn the etiquette of the game, Jennifer Ingall the sub-committee secretary who not only deals with all our correspondence but also was the innovator of the Association newsletter that received such good response this year, Rod Rosenfield who has been fielding the day to day questions and enquiries and been a strong back-up to our competition secretaries for finding reserve players( and of course the woman behind the man, Jenny Rosenfield for all her efforts in this area as well, only the Rosenfields would know the hours put in by all the committees of the Association), and Troy Mahoney and Jamie Byrnes who ran last year's Grade Tournament and who can be relied upon to offer support and assistance when required whether it be a tournament or some assistance with a competition or previous accepted practice of the Committee. To all of you on the committee I say THANK YOU in the biggest possible way. It would be remiss also, not to mention the efforts of that ever-tireless worker, Pat Healy, who has not only typed up all our draws and checked registrations, but also offered us sound advice from her years of experience with the Gosford Association. The entire Committee says thanks to you.



In the last year, our competitions remained fairly consistent with their numbers, no small part due to our secretaries. The following number of teams entered each of the 3 competitions in the last year:

Tuesday	23 teams	27 teams	24 teams
Thursday	21 teams	22 teams	17 teams
Saturday	22 teams	25 teams	25 teams

Tuesday Night competition on average caters for over 140 players, Thursday Night competition on average caters for over 120 players and Saturday Afternoon competition on average caters for over 140 players.

The Grade tournament was well down on numbers last year and also had some problems with weather and unavailability of players. To this day, some of the events remain unfinished. Due to this very fact, a new approach was taken this year in that the events of the Grade Tournament have been split into three – Handicap & Veterans, Open & Special, and Grade and run at different times of the year. August 25 & September 1 for the Handicap & Veterans, October 13 & 20 for the Open & Special events and November 17 & 24 for the Individual Grading events. The first of these consecutive weekend events has been held and entries were very disappointing. We hope as a committee that the Association players will better patronize the entries for the coming events.

As mentioned previously, this year, basically by the efforts of the sub-committee secretary, we saw the inaugural Association newsletter published. Jennifer Ingall has put in a mighty effort to see this popular addition to the Association continue and I hope she is able to maintain it in the coming year. I know Jennifer could do with some assistance for this feature and any help offered would be greatly appreciated.

The last year saw the Association also conduct a survey amongst current and former players of the Association seeking some guidance as to what sort of things they would like to see change, what sort of suggestions they could make to help the Association provide better service to its players and any other things they might like to express. About 10% of the association past and present members responded and quite a varied set of suggestions made. The Committee would like to take the time to thank all those who responded and some efforts have already been made to act upon suggestions in the future.

In conclusion, as the retiring chairperson of the competition, I'd like to thank all my committee for their support over the last year. It has been a pleasure to work with such quality and with people who share the same



passion for the game as myself. I know they will maintain the standards in the coming year and I wish them every success. I would also like to thank the Association Committee for all their support and wish them well for the future. When time allows, I will still "dabble" with tennis association events & functions, and continue to support the Association. Unfortunately, as you are aware, work commitments and time restraints do not allow me to maintain my position on both Committees, but they will still have my support as they move forward in this exciting new century.

January, 2002 started once again a busy time for all GDTA Committee members with the 16 Nationals, Gosford Junior Open and the Gosford Open.

Some of our Junior players fared well in the Junior Open – Abbie Stone R/U 10/U Girls singles, Crona Bailey winning the 12/U Girls Doubles with Kirsty Grady, Peta Day partnered by Shane Braham winning the 15/U Mixed Doubles.

The Junior Badge Competition has had two competitions so far this year with the next one to start on 19/10/02. Numbers were slightly down in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Comp., but hopefully now that some of the other sports are finished we can get more players in our 3<sup>rd</sup> and final competition for this year.

Competition is very keen in the Junior Pennants again. with a new comp. starting after the school holidays.

Two Junior teams played in the Sydney Inter District Competition for 2002. One in the Esca Stephens Cup – 14/U Boys. and one in the Irene Matthews Cup – 14/U Girls. The Girls team winning the play-off for their division.

Twelve teams played in the Northumberland Inter District Competition. 14/U Mixed – 14/U Boys – 12/U Boys making it to the Semi Finals and 14/U Mixed – 12/U Boys and 1 10/U Boys playing in the Finals. 14/U Mixed overall winner of this competition and of course 10/U Boys I winner and R/U.

The Junior Club Championships are almost complete with a few matches to be played this Sunday. Entries overall were better than last year with approximately 160 players competing.

Lastly, I would like to thank the Junior Committee Members for all their help and support during 2002. Patrick King for his tireless effort in running the Junior Badge Competition helped by Marilyn Brooks, Betty Light, Chris Cox and Maureen Rowe. Also a big thank you to Patrick for standing in for me during the Junior Club Championships. To Rod & Jenny Rosenfield for arranging the Junior Pennant Competition. To Stephen Gibson for his support during the Inter District.
