In the event of wet weather, if any match does not complete four (4) sets, this, or these matches will be replayed as a deferred match at the end of the round on a Wednesday, or at Committee's discretion.

Any complex using two different surfaces will be deemed as two separate complexes.

Rule 7.2. Reads: If match cannot be called off by 8.30am then all teams should go to their respective venues. Should court be unplayable at 9.30am, all teams to wait up to one hour. If teams unable to commence their match by 10.30am, then this is declared a wet match and points to be shared evenly.
