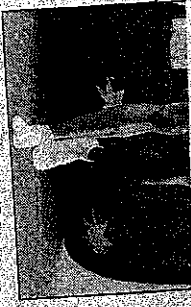

# \$10m tennis club plan

## Alexander serves city a new sporting facility

NEWCASTLE could soon be  
hosting international tennis  
tournaments if a \$10 million  
plan to redevelop District  
Park Tennis Courts is  
realised.  
Former Australian Davis  
Cup tennis star and Channel  
Seven commentator John  
Alexander wants to develop a  
one-stop sporting and social  
facility on the site of the  
present licensed club, retain-  
ing the 25 tennis courts. Cen-  
tral to the proposal is

developing and encouraging  
young tennis talent.  
While the plan is at an early  
stage, he has already  
approached stakeholders  
including the Newcastle Dis-  
trict Tennis Association, the  
licensed club and the trustees  
who manage the Crown Land  
on behalf of the State Govern-  
ment.  
Under the proposal, the site  
would be retained as Crown  
Land on a long lease.

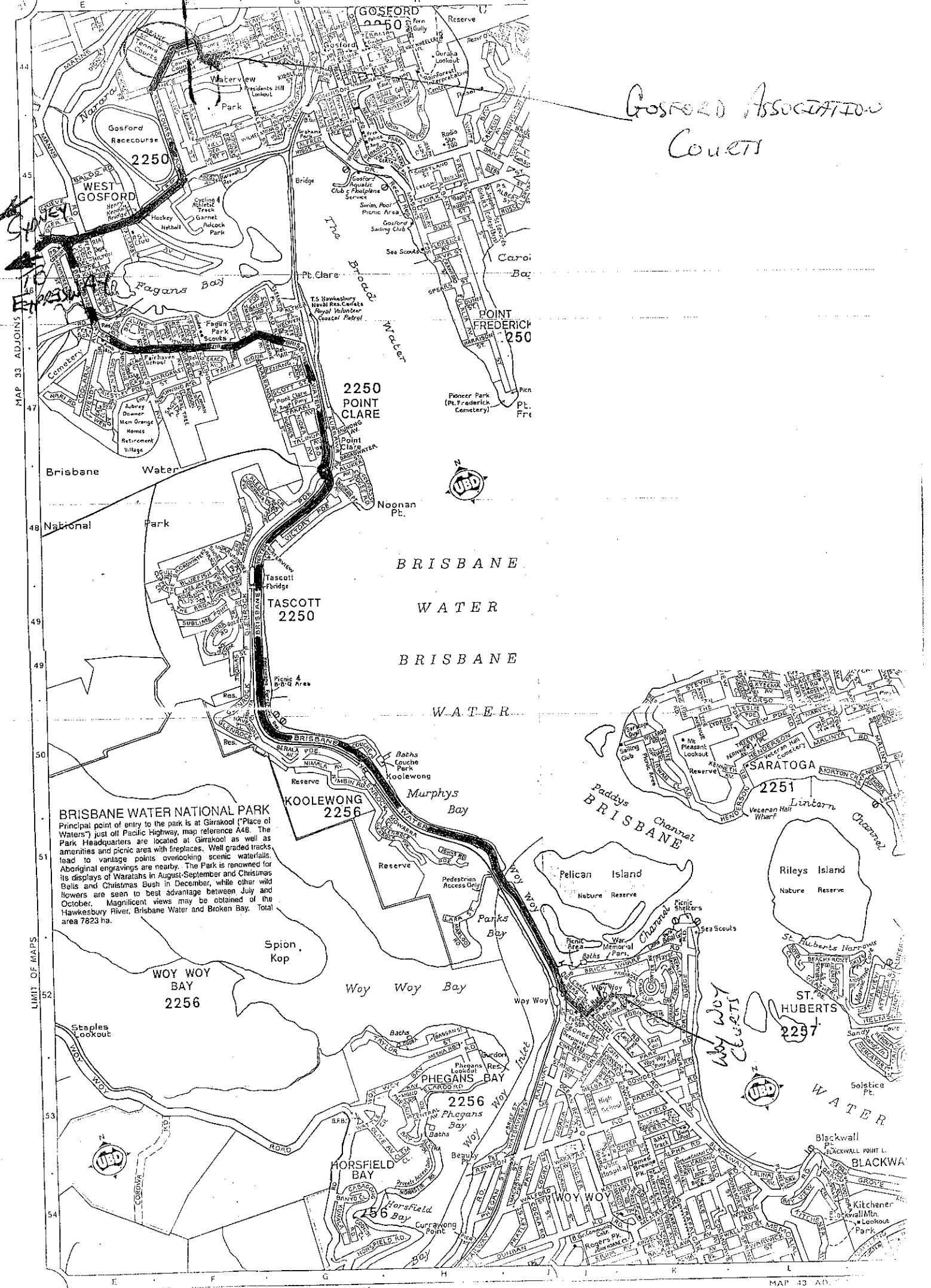
Mr Alexander has done  
similar developments else-  
where.  
The proposal is to be devel-  
oped by his own business  
John Alexander's Clubs.  
The plan was to put a large  
building on the site of the  
present licensed club build-  
ing and the five unused tennis  
courts fronting Lambton  
Road.  
It would include a gym, a  
25 metre indoor pool, squash

courts, health facilities, a  
childcare centre and a coffee  
shop.  
There would be another  
25-metre outdoor pool and all  
25 of the playable tennis  
courts would be retained.  
The club would be equip-  
ped for various kinds of exer-  
cise and would offer classes  
such as ballet and martial  
arts.  
"We would try to put as  
many activities as we can

under one roof," he said. "The  
core to that is tennis. There's  
a possibility of establishing  
some indoor courts if it's  
agreed that is appropriate."  
"Player development is an  
important thing to us to give  
children every opportunity."  
Licensed premises might  
not be part of the develop-  
ment with club membership  
fees proposed to fund the  
business.  
Newcastle and District

Tennis Association president  
Warren Biley has welcomed  
the proposal.  
"We have had a meeting a  
couple of weeks ago where we  
discussed the concept with  
members and it was very well  
received," he said.  
"The idea is to get people  
playing tennis and using the  
gym frequently."  
Mr Alexander said a lot of  
sporting talent had come out  
of Newcastle.  
"I'm a great believer in the  
future of Newcastle and this  
type of club would work very  
well in Newcastle."

**BRISBANE WATER NATIONAL PARK**  
Principal point of entry to the park is at Girrakool ("Place of Waters") just off Pacific Highway, map reference A48. The Park Headquarters are located at Girrakool as well as amenities and picnic area with fireplaces. Well graded tracks lead to vantage points overlooking scenic waterfalls. Aboriginal engravings are nearby. The Park is renowned for its displays of Waratahs in August-September and Christmas Bells and Christmas Bush in December, while other wild flowers are seen to best advantage between July and October. Magnificent views may be obtained of the Hawkesbury River, Brisbane Water and Broken Bay. Total area 7823 ha.
