

TENNIS COMMITTEE REPORT - 8/10/86

OCTOBER WEEKEND 4-5-6 TENNIS TOURNAMENT

The Committee has concentrated for the past 4 weeks on preparations for the running of the above tournament.

Overall one feels that it was well planned and executed, with the help from favourable weather conditions.

On review, there were good and bad points and some recommendations to be noted.

Problems

1. 2½% bad debts still occurred (much less than last year).
This time the names of the debtors will be sent to their clubs where possible - and provided we are not in error, they will be asked to deal with the problem.
2. Pseudonyms

Some people used false names, perhaps humerously, but they hid their real identity and produced a problem in grading. This should be discouraged.
3. One party of beer drinkers caused trouble at the organisor's table and on the courts, but though irrirating, was on a minor scale.

The majority of the visitors were just good sports.

Notable good Points:

1. Strong team of workers in the organising Committee: notable hard labour by:- Dennis Stimson, Bob Burgess, Alf Stonestreet Rex Preddy, Steve Gibson - (a tower of strength) and on Sunday night Greg Healy and others.

2. Catering at BBQ successful.
3. Sandwich and Coffee Shop - successful
4. Chris Cox was extremely helpful with Trophies and alcohol dispensing.
5. Treasurer Bob Reid and helper Denise Smith did a good job.
6. Announcers Geoff Bridge, Angus Hextall and Doug Meagher were on top of the situation every day.
7. Special mention of Rex Preddy, tireless worker for the club and Ray Smith - early starts and clean courts.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

1. *Rain*
Ron made it most obvious to the organisers and others that there is an urgent need for 5 or 9 more grass courts. Planning should start now.
2. Revision is needed of the Entry Forms and insistence of correct name and address and grading with a note "Incomplete Forms may be rejected".
3. Have someone on the Tournament Committee who can help with seeding players.
